We are studying the life of David and have noticed the great testimony that scripture records concerning his heart. King Saul, though a talented king, had done foolishly and stopped obeying God, and as a result, God rejected Saul as being king. God's desire was to replace Saul with a "man after his own heart" (1 Sam. 13:13-14).

To identify the next king, the Lord sent Samuel to the house of Jesse to anoint one of his sons as the next king. When Samuel saw Jesse's oldest son Eliab, he thought surely that he was going to be the next king. Then God taught each of us a very valuable lesson.

But the LORD said to Samuel, "Do not consider his appearance or his height, for I have rejected him. The LORD does not look at the things people look at. People look at the outward appearance, but the LORD looks at the heart." 1 Samuel 16:7

What we learn from this event is the importance God places on the heart. Oh how often we get things backwards and put emphasis on the outward appearance. David did not look the part of a king. Scripture says he was young and ruddy. But God looks at the inner man and David had his heart in the right place. The New Testament reiterates the character of David's heart.

After removing Saul, he made David their king. God testified concerning him: 'I have found David, son of Jesse, a man after my own heart; he will do everything I want him to do.' Acts 13:22

As we work together to "develop minds, build character and nurture faith" might we continue to remember the importance God puts on our heart. When God looks to choose someone for a particular task, it is the heart that God looks at.



### Lunch Program

We are excited to be launching a new lunch program that will complement the home and foster a healthy living school environment. From both our experience and research, we recognize that a healthy living school environment maximizes students' learning potential and success, and enhances students' social and emotional well-being. In helping students live healthy, we have committed to teaching students the skills to make healthy choices and reinforcing those through school practices.

We are offering a 2 day per week optional Lunch Program on Tuesdays and Thursdays that will meet the standards of our Provincial Health Unit. Lunch will include all four food groups with an additional serving of fruit or veggies. The cost to each student will be \$5 per lunch, per day for a senior portion or \$4 per lunch per day for a junior portion. Senior portions will be larger – for example double portions of meat, or a second hot dog or slice of pizza. Lunches must be pre-ordered for planning / preparation purposes. There is a Family Meal Plan option for \$10 per family per meal.
