Moses is one of the many examples of faith we have listed in Hebrews 11. That is not the complete story though.

Moses is also one of the many examples of faith listed in Hebrews 11 that suffered much for God's glory: some were tortured, others suffered mocking and flogging, chains and imprisonment, were stoned and even killed with a sword. Each of these men and women, the author of the book of Hebrews tells us, "the world was not worthy of them." We are thankful for each man and woman that has made an intentional decision to follow God, despite the circumstance, setting a wonderful example for each of us! May our life in turn be an example to those that look on!


