This past month we have further progressed in our study discussing our walk with God. There is no greater joy than walking in a relationship with our Creator God each day. It is a delight to each of us staff members at CCA to both walk with God and to help direct our students to daily walk with God in a relationship with Him through Jesus. Our key verse is found in third John.

I have no greater joy than this, to hear of my children walking in the truth. 3 John 1:4

We have begun our study focusing on a walk with God in truth. What is truth? Can we know truth? Is truth relative or self-defined? How do we walk with God in truth? Possibly some questions we may have asked ourselves in the past as we thought of our own life, our surroundings and eternity. We have opened our Bibles together during our Chapel time and have drawn a few conclusions.

Firstly, we learn from the Bible that the Word of God is truth. Not everything we read in newspaper print or on the internet can we assert "that is truth". But when we come to the Word of God, we read it and meditate on it with a different mindset, not trying to discern whether or not it is truth, but allow the truth of Scripture to find root in our heart and soul and influence our life.

Jesus said to his father

o Sanctify them by your word, your word is truth. John 17:17

The second conclusion we made is Jesus is truth. Everything Jesus said, did, instructed was truth. He was the exact representation of God, God in flesh, and he lived a life declaring truth. In John 14 he declared that he was the way, the truth and the life.

 Jesus said to them, I am the way, the truth and the life. Nobody comes to the Father except through me. John 14:6

A third conclusion we made regarding truth is that Jesus taught us that the truth will set us free. When we are truthful with our sin, truthful to God, truthful to others and truthful with ourselves, we are free from the burden that we carry. When we are truthful to God regarding our sin and accept God's truth of salvation

in Jesus Christ, we are free from both the burden of sin and the penalty of our sin - Praise God!

Then you will know the truth, and the truth will set you free. John 8:32



Auction Update

Please remember each family's requirement:

- **Donate** an item/items valued at \$100. (These are tax receipt-able if your sales receipts are attached.) Due by November 3rd.
 - Please consider your donation carefully! The goal is for you to spend less on a donation than what someone will be willing to pay for that same item at the auction. Alternatively, you may write a cheque to CCA for \$100 and those funds will be used to purchase items for the auction on your behalf. Please fill out the family donation form in this packet and attach one to each donation. Family donations are tracked and families that do
- Solicit a minimum of two businesses. Grab a few copies of the donation request letter and try to get a few places to donate goods or services to the auction. A good place to start is a business where you have spent money in the past. You can also send out requests via email. And yes, each family needs to solicit! If you do not solicit, then you are expected to donate more things to the auction to make up for the lack.
- Volunteer. This is an event that takes a lot of volunteers and it's a great way to accumulate your required hours. Volunteers are needed in the following areas:

 - o clean-up Saturday evening (Nov 18)
 - decorating
 - o food prep/service
 - registration
 - o check-out
 - o data entry
 - silent auction table closing
 - extra soliciting (in addition to the 2 required)


Parent Teacher Interviews
