Field Trips

Tuesday April 3rd

Grades 4 - 5

The Mississippi Valley Conservation Authority will be doing an in-school presentation to grades 4 and 5 on **Spring Water Awareness** starting at 2 pm. Students will learn about the dangers of thinning ice, fast moving water, flooding and cold water temperatures.

Tuesday April 10 Grades JK - 8 Living History Morning

This year we are hosting our first ever interactive "Living History" morning where students talk with people who have lived through various decades of history and can remember the world being very different than it is today. This will take place on Tuesday, April 10th and parents are welcome to attend!

The day will begin with local author and storyteller Mary Cook meeting in the gym with grades 5-8 from 9am-10am. She will be talking to them about growing up in rural Ontario in the 1930's and 40's. Following Mary Cook, grades 1-8 will meet in the gym from 10am-11am. We will be having a panel of special guests who the students will get to interview about growing up in a different era where games, clothing and daily life looked a little bit different than today. Over the first activity break, they will learn some classic recess games that were played by some of our special guests. The kindergartens will be involved in these activities as well.

The Ontario social studies curriculum is heavily focused on getting students to 'inquire' about the world around them and ask good questions. The intention of this morning is to have students think about the way the world has changed. It's also an opportunity for students to see the adults in their lives as primary sources of information about history. Finally, it is an opportunity for students to catch a glimpse of a world not dominated by screens and when entertainment was much simpler and often created by the children themselves.

Wednesday April 18 Grades 4, 5, 6 and 7 University of Ottawa "Scratch" Workshop

Through the Maker Mobile department of the U Ottawa Faculty of Engineering, students will learn to program their own interactive stories and games. In the process, they will learn to solve problems, design projects and express themselves creatively on laptops during the "Scratch" workshop. Laptops will be provided.



We have both posters and professionally printed postcards in the office to be handed out to promote our run. Please consider picking up some and circulating them to your contacts.


Sponsorship
