

## October 2022

Have you ever felt love and hate at the same time? Two emotions competing in your mind about the same thing? Recently, I felt the two emotions simultaneously during an accounting course I am in. Now, anyone who knows me well knows that I hate math, but I love people and love learning, so taking an accounting class produced this love/hate feeling in my heart. The mixed emotions were probably evident to my peers and professor - at the start of the class it was obvious that I was so excited to be there. I would enter the room and say hello, wave at people, make small talk and I even tried the odd joke to my new friends (often with very little response from my classmates who clearly appreciate numbers more than jokes, no offence to my accountant friends). But I was a different person and it did not take long for the "hate" feeling to sink in once the professor opened up Excel - no more jokes from me.

Despite my initial feelings about the accounting, after a few weeks I found I was enjoying some of the content I was learning. Don't get me wrong, I wasn't texting my friends to talk about ratios or anything crazy, but I was starting to apply some of what I was learning in my life and job - which I found cool. And I started to notice something about accounting - there is a formula for everything, hundreds of them everything has a formula or equation to work it out. Without formulas, accounting would be virtually impossible (thank you Excel). I am not sure who the geniuses were that wrote accounting formulas such as: ROE $=R O A \times E M=N I / A \times A / E=P M \times T A T O \times E M=N I / S \times S / A$ $x A / E$ or who programmed Excel to compute these formulas, but I do know that I have a new found appreciation for those math-minded geniuses! I find it amazing that accountants can make sense of thousands of formulas, ratios, equations, and computations and know how to interpret them to tell the financial story and make sense to business owners to plan and strategize for the future. Most of the time even when I found the answer, I didn't even know what the number meant and could certainly never advise someone. Another thing I noticed and appreciated about accounting is the consistency. When I collaborated with my peers, we would compare answers and found that if we all put the right numbers in the formula, we all got the same, right answer -the formula worked! I learned that I could count on and trust the consistency of the computation to give me exactly what I wanted.

While making a 'cheat sheet' of all the formulas for the final exam it struck me that the Bible is sort of like an accounting cheat sheet. The Bible has all sorts of "formulas" and "equations" in it that are also consistent and that I can count on and trust. When we put the right content in, and use the right formula, we too will get a consistent answer - God's formulas work! It's really not surprising since God is the author of life, and He, like Excel, can interpret what we put in, and make sense of it all to produce an "answer" that is consistently what we want - after all, we have the freedom to choose the formula for a desired outcome. If you've never read the book of Proverbs, check it out, it is full of "formulas" for life! For example, see Proverbs 3:5,6;

Trust in the LORD with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding; in all your ways acknowledge him, and he will direct your path.
Or, in accounting terms: Trust Lord (TL)+Heart (H)+ Lean on own understanding (LOU) $\times(0)+$ Acknowledge God (AG) $=$ Direction for life (DP) $=$ Peace ( $P$ )

Or, if you want to work break it down, work backwards, deconstruct, or flip the equation (not sure why accounts do this, but they do)
Confusion (Cf)+uncertainty of life $(U C)=$ Anxiety $(A x)=$ Trust self (TS)+ lean on own understanding (LOU)+ Ignore God (IG)
This way of looking at scripture as a formula is just a "fun" way of interpreting a verse in a straightforward manner. But most of us know that life is never straightforward, and there are a multitude of variables in life equations. I want to assure you that you can trust God, who made you, to write and re-write "formulas" or "equations" for your life that give you the outcome you want. God can give you a purposeful and fulfilling life with meaning and peace. I challenge you to look at the Bible with your accounting glasses on and make a 'cheat sheet' of life equations you want to apply. And, at the risk of sounding like a geek - please share, I would love to study them too!

## Sickness

As expected, September has brought on the back to school sniffles. If you have any questions about symptoms and sickness, or are wondering if kids need to stay home, please use the provincial screening tool, for direction. For your records the link is found here:

As a school we know that there is going to be runny noses and some sniffles, we ask that if your child is obviously sick and uncomfortable, please keep them home. If we notice that symptoms are worsening or a child is not themselves, we will ask you to come pick them up. Students who are fevered, vomiting, or have diarrhea must go home and be symptom-free for 24 hours before returning to school.
Rapid tests are not necessary to navigate symptoms - rather good sense, and some direction from the screening tool, if necessary. Covid is no longer the focus and seems to be something that we are going to learn to live with, the focus has changed to awareness of ANY sickness and preventing the spread of any cold/flu with good common sense. Any sickness (even if you had a positive rapid test) is a return to school/work after 24 hours of improved symptoms. Masks after sickness are recommended by the screening tool, but we will not be enforcing them.
